

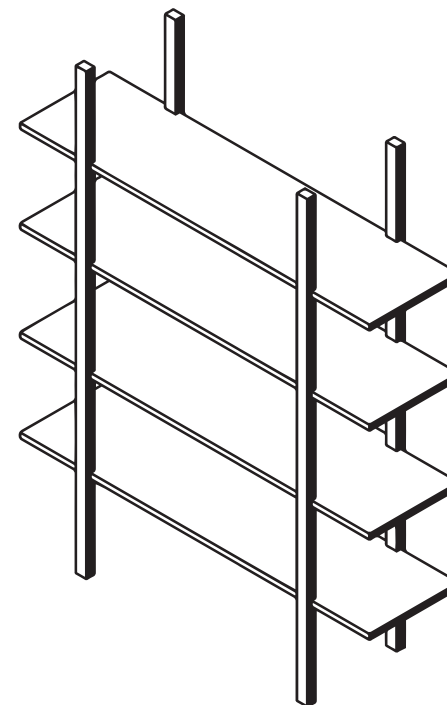

The Wooden Shelf

Award-winning solid oak shelf
assembles without additional fixings
using a dovetail feature.

Treated wood

Please note that this shelf system is treated
with a matt lacquer to protect the wood.

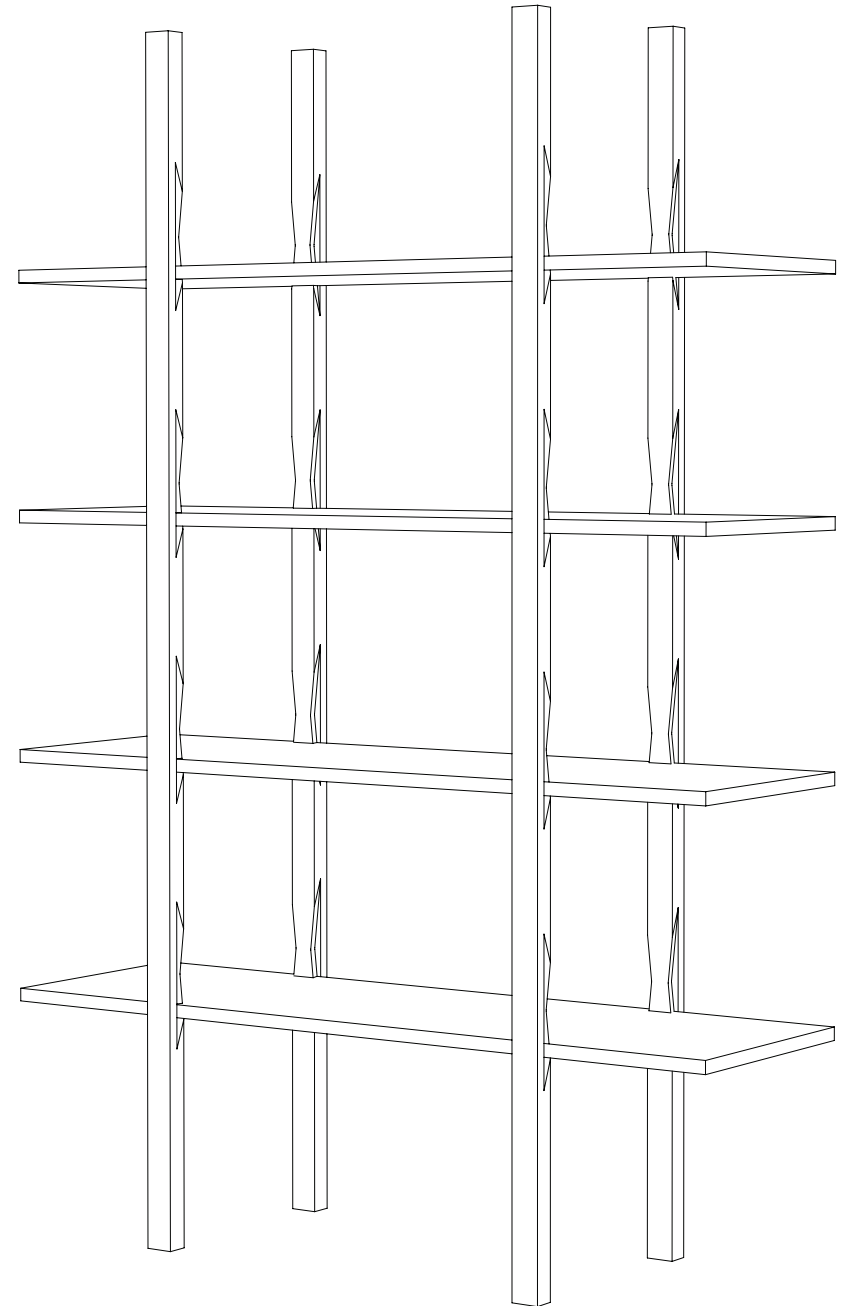
We recommend that you do not place this
item up against or beside a radiator and not
in direct sunlight.

Not in a unheated house or room below 12
degrees.

Do not place any hot or wet items directly
onto the wooden surface.

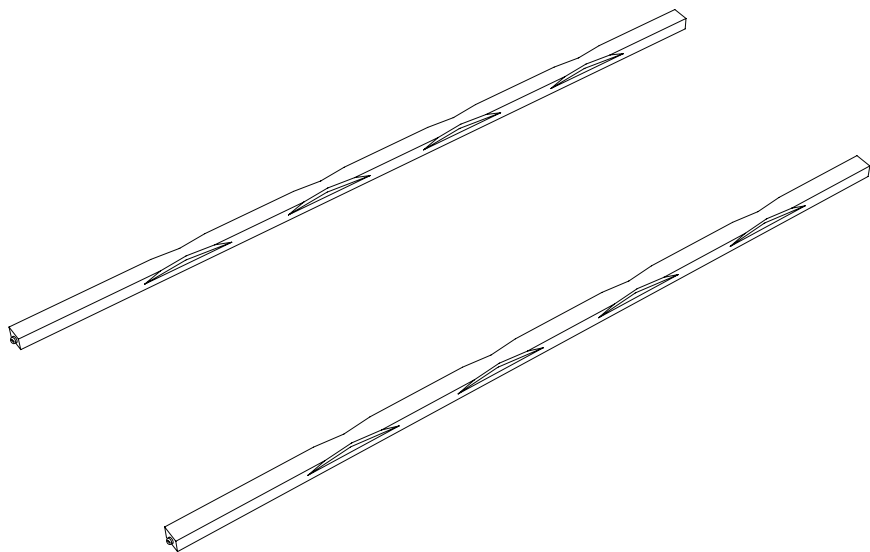
Clean with gentle soap and a wrung-out
cloth.

Step 06



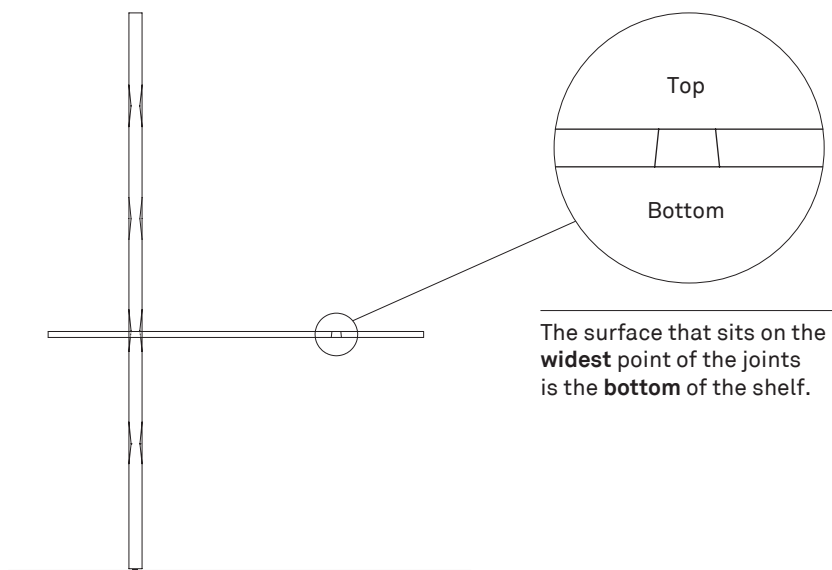
Step 01

Place two uprights on the floor, making sure both feet are at the same end.



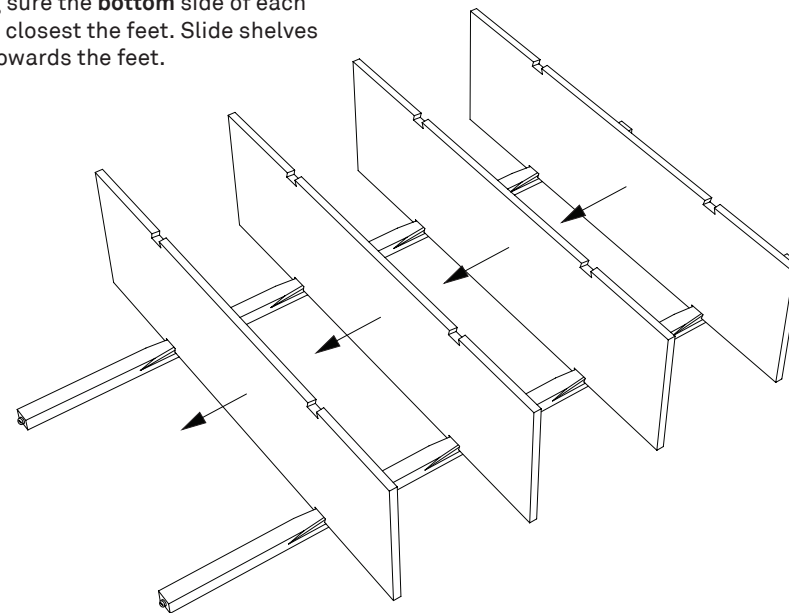
Step 02

Important! Each shelf has a top and bottom. Assembly with shelves upside down can damage the joints.



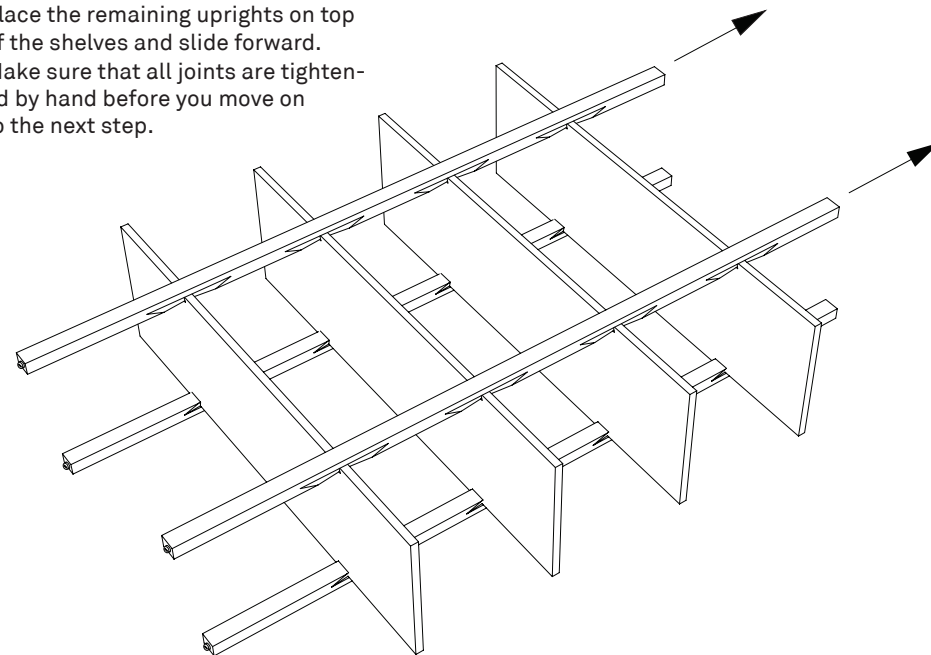
Step 03

Place all shelves on the uprights, making sure the **bottom** side of each shelf is closest the feet. Slide shelves down towards the feet.



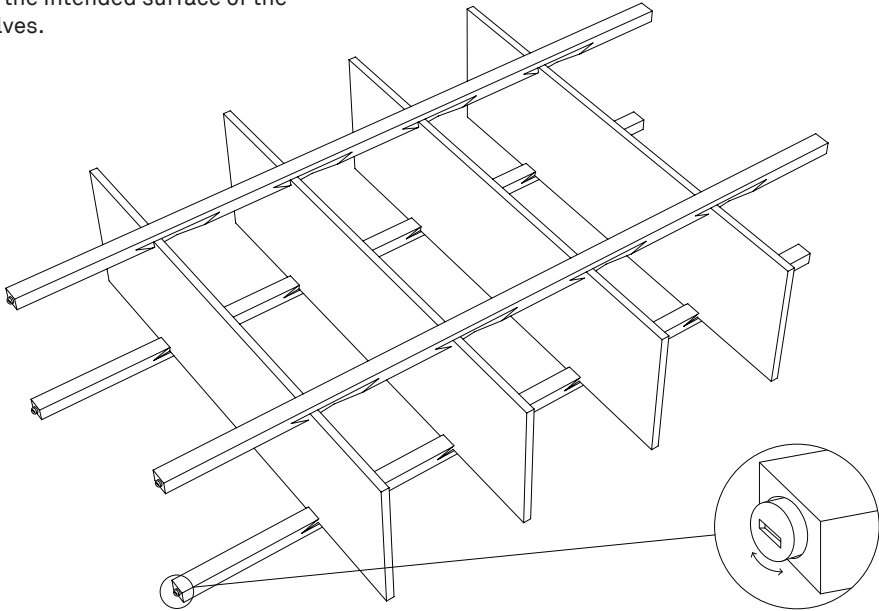
Step 04

Place the remaining uprights on top of the shelves and slide forward. Make sure that all joints are tightened by hand before you move on to the next step.



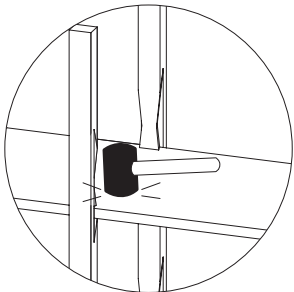
Step 05

You can now adjust the feet to suit the intended surface of the shelves.

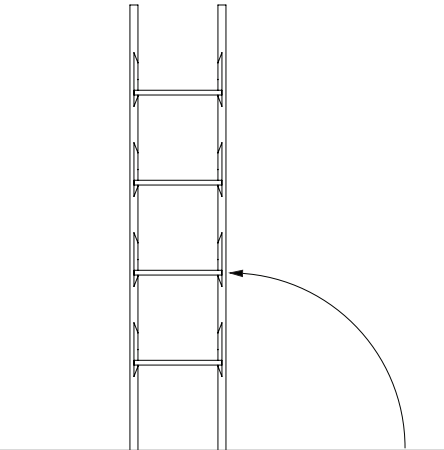


Step 06

Lift the shelf to the upright position. Using a rubber hammer, gently tap the shelves near each joint to strengthen the system.



After tightening the joints, there should be no gaps between the uprights and the shelves. If there are gaps, one or more shelves may be upside down.
